

Cleaners



- ☐ Weakness
- ☐ Extreme sleepiness
- □ Abnormal behavior
- □ Drooling or vomiting
- ☐ Shaking or Convulsions
- ☐ Swelling lips or tongue
- □ Diarrhea

- Polyurethane craft glue
- **Nicotine/Tobacco Products**
- Batteries—Alkaline, disc
- Antifreeze & automotive liquids
- **Human personal care products**
- Medications (Prescription, over the counter, herbal)

Pet Safety Facts

Holiday Safety

- Easter grass, wrapping ribbon, string and tinsel can cause intestinal blockage if swallowed
- Keep birds away from Christmas tree ornaments, mistletoe and holly berries
- Water preservatives in from Christmas tree stands may be hazardous to pets



- Brush or wash off the snout or fur to remove the poison if needed. Rinse out the mouth, if it can be done safely.
- Call your veterinarian
