Poison Prevention Tips

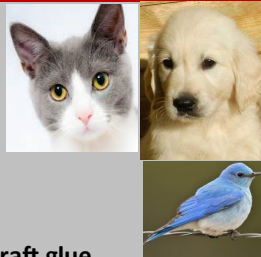
Do Not Give Pets

- × Salt
- × Garlic
- × Onions
- × Avocado
- × Coffee
- × Chocolate
- × Raisin
- × Grapes
- × Yeast dough
- × Macadamia nuts
- × Spoiled food
- × Fatty foods
- × Sugary foods
- × Products with xylitol
- × Alcohol & other drugs



Keep Away from Pets:

- Mothballs
- Pesticides
- Houseplants
- Cleaners
- Polyurethane craft glue
- Nicotine/Tobacco Products
- Batteries—Alkaline, disc
- Antifreeze & automotive liquids
- Human personal care products
- Medications (Prescription, over the counter, herbal)



Signs of Poisoning Checklist

- Weakness
- Extreme sleepiness
- Abnormal behavior
- Drooling or vomiting
- Shaking or Convulsions
- Swelling lips or tongue
- Diarrhea

Holiday Safety

- ◆ Easter grass, wrapping ribbon, string and tinsel can cause intestinal blockage if swallowed
- ◆ Keep birds away from Christmas tree ornaments, mistletoe and holly berries
- ◆ Water preservatives in from Christmas tree stands may be hazardous to pets



How to Handle a Pet Poisoning

- Brush or wash off the snout or fur to remove the poison if needed. Rinse out the mouth, if it can be done safely.
- Call your veterinarian
